This two-and-a-half-day program provides participants the opportunity to perform an in-depth dissection of the head and neck. Each laboratory session will be preceded by a lecture and discussion and will conclude with a clinical summary. Program emphasis will be on osteology, the oral cavity, the nasal cavity, the digastrics triangle, and the temporomandibular joint. The oral cavity will be dissected to demonstrate the relationship of blood vessels, nerves, glands, ducts, and muscle attachments to the performance of dental procedures. Participants will work in two-member teams, each dissecting one-half of a provided cadaver head.

At the end of the course, each participant should be able to:

- Describe osteology of the skull and name structures that pass through foramina in these bones
- Describe the structures lying beneath the floor of the mouth with special emphasis on dental practice relevance
- Understand health and pathologic conditions involving the major salivary glands of the oral cavity
- Describe the blood supply, innervation, and lymphatic drainage of the mouth, nasal cavity, digastric triangle, face, infratemporal fossa, and TM joint
- Perform a trigeminal second division nerve block on the cadaver
- Describe TM joint intra-articular disorders
- Understand the anatomy involved in the emergency tracheotomy

Henry A. Gremillion, DDS, MAGD

Dr. Gremillion is dean of the LSU School of Dentistry. He received his DDS degree from Louisiana State University and completed a fellowship in Craniomandibular Dysfunction at the University of Florida. Dr. Gremillion practiced in Cottonport, Louisiana, for over a decade. He is past president of the American Equilibration Society. In 1992, Dr. Gremillion

was named director of the Parker E. Mahan Facial Pain Center at the University of Florida College of Dentistry. He has lectured extensively in the United States and abroad and has authored or co-authored over 60 scientific articles, abstracts, and book chapters in the field of orofacial pain. His clinical interests are in the area of diagnosis and management of orofacial pain.



M. Franklin Dolwick, DMD, PhD

Dr. Dolwick received his DMD from the University of Kentucky and his PhD and certification in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from the Medical College of Virginia. He currently serves as chairman and professor for the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Florida College of Dentistry. Dr. Dolwick also serves as a

member of the Craniofacial Cleft-Palate team and the Sleep Medicine faculty. He is board-certified by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Dolwick has published over 100 papers and co-authored four books.



A. Dale Ehrlich, MS, DDS

Chairman of the Department of Comprehensive Dentistry and Biomaterials at LSU School of Dentistry and a recently retired captain in the Dental Corps, United States Navy, Dr. Ehrlich earned his DDS at Indiana University. He established the Orofacial Pain Specialty for the Navy at the Naval Postgraduate Dental School (NPDS) and served as the first specialty leader for Temporomandibular Disorders and Orofacial Pain. At NPDS, he

co-founded the first DOD Orofacial Pain Center and DOD Orofacial Pain Residency program. Dr. Ehrlich is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain.

This course presents the latest information available on dentin bonding systems and direct composite resins, including self-etching adhesives and nano-composites. Dr. Swift will also cover two important topics in the area of indirect restorations: precision impression materials and luting cements. In the area of esthetic dentistry, participants will receive an update on tooth whitening and porcelain veneers. The clinical applications and use of all materials will be emphasized.
